I hope you are well. Attached to this email is a word version of our Draft Eagle Conservation Plan for the Black Oak project. We'd appreciate review and comments back in the next two weeks. A redline of the document would be just fine. Our surveys are ongoing, and the document is as current as we can make it based on the data we have. The tree with the nest in it near the project has tipped over a fair amount and the nest was sitting sideways. The eagles have returned however and leveled out the nest with new building. If there is a strong wind storm through the area it is likely the whole thing will go down but until then we will monitor the activities. There are no other new nests in the area. We did observe some spring migratory activity and that is included here.
