- Timing and methods of bat monitoring are not sufficient to demonstrate bat activity during migration season.
- Can project comply with shadow flicker limit of less than 30 hours annually?
- Have all eagle nests in area been reported and impacts considered?
- What is impact on property values and tax payments?
- <u>Prevention</u> of radio, television and microwave interference, not mitigation afterward. Need independent study BEFOREHAND.
- Karst areas, unstable bedrock, within footprint must be avoided.
- Project not consistent, as noted by Dept. of Commerce EERA, for wetland setback.


