

Dear Clerk of Appellate Court:

Enclosed for filing on behalf of Relator Association of Freeborn County Landowners (AFCL), is this month's status update and the Certificate of Service in the above-captioned matter.

On March 31, 2020, the Commission filed its ORDER DENYING AFCL'S PETITIONS AND AMENDING SITE PERMIT. Adversely affected parties have 20 days to file for reconsideration, and other parties have 10 days to respond. Minn. R. 7829.3000, Subp. 1, Subp. 4. The Commission could make its decision thereafter, putting a decision at least 30 days in the future, i.e., May 1, 2020, or if the Commission does not take up reconsideration, it would be denied as a matter of law 60 days later.

Association of Freeborn County Landowners have also filed an appeal of the Public

Utilities Commission's denial of its Petition for Environmental Assessment Worksheet at its

February 6, 2020 meeting. Court File A20-0410. Notice of the decision was provided to the

Environmental Quality Board, and that notice was published in the February 18, 2020 EQB

Monitor, triggering the 30 day window for appeal, despite the Commission's failure to issue an

Order and Record of Decision. AFCL has filed a Motion to consolidate that related docket with

the above-captioned docket. As above, the ORDER DENYING AFCL'S PETITIONS AND

AMENDING SITE PERMIT was filed on March 31, 2020. Also as above, adversely affected

parties have 20 days to file for reconsideration, and other parties have 10 days to respond. Minn.

R. 7829.3000, Subp. 1, Subp. 4. The Commission could make its decision thereafter, putting a

decision at least 30 days in the future, i.e., May 1, 2020, or if the Commission does not take up

reconsideration, it would be denied as a matter of law 60 days later.

It will be at least 30 days before AFCL's administrative remedies are exhausted, and the

Commission addresses reconsideration of these matters, and it may likely be longer.
