- 1. YOU ARE BEING SUED. The Plaintiff has started a lawsuit against you. - 3. **YOU MUST RESPOND TO EACH CLAIM.** The Answer is your written response to the Plaintiff's Complaint. In your Answer you must state whether you agree or disagree with each paragraph of the Complaint. If you believe the Plaintiff should not be given everything asked for in the Complaint, you must say so in your Answer.
- 4. YOU WILL LOSE YOUR CASE IF YOU DO NOT SEND A WRITTEN RESPONSE TO THE COMPLAINT TO THE PERSON WHO SIGNED THIS

**SUMMONS.** If you do not Answer within 20 days, you will lose this case. You will not get to tell your side of the story, and the Court may decide against you and award the Plaintiff everything asked for in the complaint. If you do not want to contest the claims stated in the complaint, you do not need to respond. A default judgment can then be entered against you for the relief requested in the complaint.

- 5. LEGAL ASSISTANCE. You may wish to get legal help from a lawyer. If you do not have a lawyer, the Court Administrator may have information about places where you can get legal assistance. Even if you cannot get legal help, you must still provide a written Answer to protect your rights or you may lose the case.

Plaintiff Mark Fischer, by and through his undersigned Attorney, and on behalf of the State of Minnesota, states and alleges, upon evidence and knowledge as to its own acts and otherwise upon information and belief, as follows:

#### NATURE OF THE ACTION

- 1. The Plaintiff, Mark Fischer (hereinafter "Fischer"), a natural person residing within the City of Northfield, State of Minnesota, brings this Action pursuant to the Minnesota Environmental Rights Act (hereinafter "MERA"), Minn. Stat. Chapter 116B, specifically Minn. Stat. §116B.10, which provides a cause of action to challenge a permit issued by "the state," in this case, the City of Northfield.
  - 2. The City of Northfield is a home rule charter city, an instrumentality of the state.
- 3. Fischer is seeking declaratory and equitable relief, and to enjoin the City of Northfield from further impairing, polluting, or destroying the City footprint of the full multipart powerline upgrade and uprate to a 3-phase, including remitter to the City for environmental

review of the phased and connected actions of this multi-part powerline upgrade and uprate, and review and public process by the Planning Commission and City Council.

- 4. The powerline upgrade and uprate is below the 115 kilovolt and line length thresholds for jurisdiction of the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission, and thus falls within City permitting authority.
- 5. Fischer brings this action to challenge the permits and draft permits issued by the City staff without City or public process. Because there has been no City or public process, there is no administrative process to exhaust. Fischer requests remitter to the City for environmental review and public process.
- 6. Judicial review and remitter to the City for environmental review and public process is urgently needed, as the removal of trees marks the beginning of construction of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase of this project, which Xcel Energy wishes to complete by year end. Plaintiff is unaware of the schedule for the remaining length of the line connecting to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Street substation.

### **BACKGROUND**

- 7. On or about November 3, 2020, Plaintiff Fischer discovered three Asplundh trucks on the street near his home, and he inquired as to the work they were doing.
- 8. In a discussion with the Asplundh workers and Xcel Energy's Mike Palmer, Fischer was told that the company was trimming and cutting down trees in preparation for a powerline project to install a 3-phase powerline, at 8 kilovolts per phase, and installing taller poles to accommodate the upgraded and uprated powerline. The technical specifications have not yet been verified. The 35 foot poles along 7th Street will, at 45 feet, be 10 feet higher.
- 9. Fischer has contacted the City Engineering staff, the Mayor and a City Councilor, and Xcel Energy's Mike Palmer overseeing the project. The Mayor and Councilor were unaware of

this project, did not know of this project until contacted by Fischer.

- 10. A Data Practices Act Request was made to the City of Northfield, the request and full response to which is attached to this Complaint. Ex. A, Data Request, p. 11-12; Data Request Response, pps. 1-17.
- 11. The instant powerline project in Northfield from 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Prairie to 7<sup>th</sup> Street to Washington, ending in front of City Hall is the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of a multi-phase powerline project intended to connect a solar generation facility on Wall Street, east of the City, to a substation located at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, on State Highway 3. See Ex. A, email, Palmer to Bennett and Simonson, March 13, 2020. Of the several phased and contiguous projects identified, one is completed, the instant project was permitted on October 21, and the remaining portions to connect to the substation remain unknown.
- 12. Phase 1 of this powerline project begins at the solar generating facility on Wall Street east of Northfield and extends to 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Prairie in Northfield.
- 13. Phase 2 of this powerline project is the one discovered by Mark Fischer, from 5<sup>th</sup> and Prairie south to 7<sup>th</sup> Street, west on 7<sup>th</sup> Street to Washington, and south across 8<sup>th</sup> Street to a point in front of Northfield's City Hall. Ex. A, p. 6-8, 10 (p. 9 shows a part of a 5<sup>th</sup> Street route, which is, upon information and belief, not to be utilized).
- 14. Upon information and belief, admitted by Xcel Energy and City Engineering staff, the route and plans for the subsequent phase(s) of this project are unknown. It has not yet been determined what route the powerline will take through town to reach the 2<sup>nd</sup> Street substation.
- 15. At this time, the power line, whether Phase I, or Phase I and Phase 2, is a powerline to nowhere, a radial line that does not connect into the electrical grid. The solar project east of Northfield cannot interconnect through this powerline until the multi-phased project is complete.

It is not known whether the solar project to be interconnected is currently operation and interconnected through some other powerline, if it is under construction timed with the powerline upgrade/uprate, or if it is constructed but not yet operational. Wind turbines in the area are interconnected through the local distribution system, and it is possible the existing distribution system is being similarly utilized.

16. The Data Practices Act Request response reveals two emails from Mike Palmer, Xcel Energy, dated March 12, 2020 and May 13, 2020. There were only these two emails from Xcel, and there were **NO** other emails and no emails **FROM** the City to Xcel Energy that were included in the response.

17. The March 12, 2020 email includes a map of the initial 8,508.83 foot proposed route along 5<sup>th</sup> Street and then a circuitous route south, across the river, through Ames Park, up and across Highway 3, over an office building and the restored historic Depot, completing the circuit at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Street substation, going beyond the 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Washington end point of the project as permitted:



Data Practices Act Request response, email and map, p. 13<sup>1</sup>.

- 18. Typically, a generation project is responsible for the cost of powerline upgrades necessary for interconnection of a project.
- 19. Upon information and belief, there is electrical infrastructure, distribution or transmission, undergrounded below 4<sup>th</sup> Street. It is unknown whether there is electrical or physical room for additional cables in that installation.
- 20. Xcel Energy is familiar with undergrounding of electric powerlines, as above underneath Northfield's 4<sup>th</sup> Street, in newer subdivisions, and of undergrounding higher voltage transmission lines, such as the Hiawatha transmission project on East 26<sup>th</sup> Street in Phillips, Minneapolis and the Chisago transmission project up and down the bluffs of the St. Croix.
- 21. Undergrounding a powerline alleviates most, if not all, of the negative impacts of a powerline.
- 22. Undergrounding a powerline costs significantly more than running it above ground, however, a lower voltage line such as that proposed in this case costs much less to underground than the high voltage Hiawatha and Chisago projects. Undergrounding under a street in a flat area is far less costly than undergrounding up and down river bluffs.
- 23. The cost allocation for underground is spread throughout the area desiring undergrounding, i.e., if Northfield determined that the powerline should be built underground, the cost would be spread across the rates of the municipality through a "Miscellaneous" docket at the Public Utilities Commission, where the cost allocation is approve essentially as a matter of course following a request by the regulated utility.

- 24. From the Data Practices Act Request response, and the emails of March 12, 2020 and May 13, 2020, regarding a meeting, and upon information and belief, there was at least one meeting between Xcel Energy and City staff.
- 25. The first page of the pdf provided in response to the Data Practices Act Request appears to be notes from a meeting or discussion between Xcel and City staff. This notes that "Poles would increase 5' and would be higher" which is different than the verbally reported 10 foot increase. It also notes "No direct communication to residents." The date of these notes is unknown, as is whether these notes were contemporaneous to a meeting or discussion. Upon information and belief, there was no communication with residents whatsoever until October 28, 2020.
- 26. The permit application provided in response to the Data Practices Act Request, dated October 19, 2020, was ostensibly filed by Mike Palmer, but it is unsigned. It is unknown what information was provided, but upon information and belief, the plans on pages 6-12 that accompanied the Data Request response were attached to that application. Ex. A, p. 5 and 6-12.
- 27. Based on the emails provided, the City staff did change the proposed route from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and Xcel reviewed that route and compared numbers of trees to be removed. Ex. A, p. 14. There is no information about that route change other than the fact of the change and the numbers of trees that would need to be removed per Xcel Energy.
  - 28. The route put forward in the application stops in front of City Hall. Ex. A, p. 10.
- 29. The plans attached start at 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Prairie and end at 8<sup>th</sup> and Washington, and do not extend beyond that point and do not complete the circuit to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Street substation.
- 30. There is no information about the voltage increase, the conductor specifications and capacity, or potential environmental impacts considered and/or mitigated.

- 31. The permit was signed by Nate Becker, Engineering Technician II, City of Northfield, on October 21, 2020.
- 32. On November 6, 2020, Nate Becker stated that on October 21, 2020, when he signed the permit, work had already begun on the project, and that he was instructed to sign the permit by Sean Simonson, Engineering Manager, City of Northfield.
- 33. On October 26, 2020, a document entitled "PRIVATE UTILITIES LARGE 20201465" was issued, together with an invoice to Xcel Energy Mike Palmer, for \$135.37. Ex. A, p. 2 and 3.
- 34. Also dated October 26, 2020 was a document from Sean Simonson, Engineering Division, with the following permit conditions:
  - 1. Permittee must inform all affected property owners in writing of the proposed work prior to work commencing. Please forward written notice to the City of Northfield as well. This notice must also include a contact person for all project related questions from affected property owners.
  - 2. No trenches or excavation pits are to be left overnight. Fencing off trenches or excavation pits is not allowed.
  - 3. According to the permit, all work, including restoration is to be completed by 12/31/2020. Please contact myself if an extension is needed.
  - 4. No construction equipment shall be parked on the road or road right-of-way overnight.
  - 5. All BMP's shall be utilized at all times during construction or limit erosion from the work area.
  - 6. Tree removals shall be marked in the field prior to removal, and approved by City personnel before removal.
  - 7. The Contractor MUST inform property owners of impending tree removals, including trees in the ROW.
  - 8. The permittee is responsible for all tree and stump removals off site, and restoration as required by the permit.
  - 9. All hard surface removals will need to be put back to original condition. If weather doesn't allow final restoration, temporary hard surface replacement will be necessary until final restorations can be completed.
- Ex. A., p. 4 (see also p. 16, unknown whether this accompanied Xcel letter on p. 15).
  - 35. The Data Practices Act Request response contains a letter dated October 28, 2020 on

Xcel letterhead, to unknown recipients, with no service list or affidavit of service attached.

Tree trimming and some removal is required along 7<sup>th</sup> St E from Prairie St to Washington St to upgrade the existing electrical system. The trees marked with red tape (6 trees in total) will be removed with some trimming needed on others. This work is being done to allow additional solar generation on this electrical distribution feeder.

Ex. A, p. 4 and 15. There is no mention of pole removal and replacement with taller poles, and no mention of the 3-phase reconfiguration and reconductor for higher capacity, or impacts.

36. The October 28, 2020 notice letter from Xcel Energy was issued after the October 21, 2020 signing of the permit, which upon information and belief based on the statements of Nate Becker was signed after work had begun.

- 37. To the extent that residents were notified a week or more after work had begun, Xcel Energy is not in compliance with the notice provisions of the permit:
  - 1. Permittee must inform all affected property owners in writing of the proposed work prior to work commencing. Please forward written notice to the City of Northfield as well. This notice must also include a contact person for all project related questions from affected property owners.
  - 7. The Contractor MUST inform property owners of impending tree

removals, including trees in the ROW.

Ex. A, p. 4 and 15.

- 38. Mark Fischer, who resides on 7<sup>th</sup> Street, did not receive the October 28, 2020 notice letter from Xcel Energy, nor any other form of notice about this project.
- 39. As above, upon information and belief, work on this project commenced before the permit was issued on October 21, 2020, one week prior to the October 28, 2020 missive from Xcel Energy.
- 40. Upon information and belief, poles are beginning to be installed along the Phase 2 right-of-way.
- 41. This multi-phase and connected powerline upgrade and uprate is to be routed and built in an existing community spreading over a footprint covering several miles<sup>2</sup>, requiring removal of many trees destroying the viewshed, installation of taller poles that extend above the existing tree-line changing the viewshed, affecting aesthetics, removing water control benefits in a low and wet area on East 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and inflicting residents and passers-by with increased levels of electric and magnetic fields.
- 42. Property values could be affected. Because several tear downs and new builds have occurred in the neighborhood, marketability as a location could also be negatively affected.
- 43. Based on the map provided by Xcel Energy in the March 13, 2020 email, the powerline would be traversing cross country, situated very closely between an apartment building on West 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and a strip mall on West 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Water; northward along the

east bank of the Cannon River, through Ames Park, crossing Highway 3 and then running directly over an office building and the restored Northfield Depot on either side of West 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. These connected projects have potential for significant environmental effects. See Ex. A, project plan map attached to March 13, 2020 email, and compare with google earth satellite and street views.

#### **COUNT ONE**

### FAILURE TO CONDUCT ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

- 44. Each of the paragraphs and foregoing allegations above are repeated and realleged as if fully related herein.
- 45. The Minnesota Environmental Policy Act requires environmental review for any state action that "Where there is potential for significant environmental effects resulting from any major governmental action, the action shall be preceded by a detailed environmental impact statement prepared by the responsible governmental unit." Minn. Stat. §116D.04, Subd. 2a.
- 46. As above, this multi-phase and connected powerline upgrade and uprate is to be routed and built in an existing community spreading over a footprint covering over two miles<sup>3</sup>, requiring removal of many trees and the installation of taller poles that extend above the existing tree-line changing, destroying the viewshed and affecting aesthetics of the neighborhood. The project will remove the trees, and in doing so, remove the water control benefits of large trees in a low and wet area on East 7<sup>th</sup> Street where most residences require sump pumps. The project would also inflict residents and passers-by with undisclosed increased levels of electric and

magnetic fields. Property values and marketability could also be negatively affected.

- 47. Based on the map provided by Xcel Energy in the March 13, 2020 email, the powerline would be traversing cross country, situated very closely between an apartment building on West 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and a strip mall on West 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Water; northward along the east bank of the Cannon River, through Ames Park, crossing Highway 3 and then running directly over an office building and the restored Northfield Depot on either side of West 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. These connected projects have potential for significant environmental effects. See Ex. A, project plan map attached to March 13, 2020 email, and compare with google earth satellite and street views.
- 48. Permitting of this project lacked environmental review. The City must take "a hard look at the salient problems and the decision lacks articulated standards and reflective findings." See e.g., *In re Claim for Benefits by Meuleners*, 725 N.W. 2d 121, 125 (Minn. Ct. App. 2006).
- 49. The permit "application" was accepted with no apparent disclosure of the project specifications, the potential human and environmental impacts, and no record or opportunity for the public to participate in building a record for the City's decision.
- 50. The permit was issued by City staff, with no environmental review or consideration of the potential significant impacts of this project.
- 51. There has been no review by City Planning Commission and City Council, and there has been no proffer of evidence, no development of a record supporting issuance of a permit, and no Findings of Fact supporting issuance of the permit.
- 52. Plaintiff seeks remitter to the City for a more detailed application with project specifications, environmental review and public process where the community and affected landowners may raise their concerns, and that the Planning Commission and City Council review

the project, consider issues raised, and make specific Findings of Fact regarding this project, sufficient to support a decision to grant or deny a permit for this project.

### **COUNT TWO**

## FAILURE TO PROVIDE NOTICE AND PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IS VIOLATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

- 53. Each of the paragraphs and foregoing allegations above are repeated and realleged as if fully related herein.
- 54. No notice of this project was provided to affected landowners until October 28, 2020, one week after the permit was granted, and just nine days after the permit was ostensibly applied for on October 19, 2020. Ex. A, p. 15.
- 55. It is not known which landowners did receive notice, as no service list or affidavit of service was attached to the October 28, 2020 letter. From the Xcel Energy Letter of October 28, 2020, it appears that only the "Residents of Northfield, 7<sup>th</sup> Street East (from Prairie St to Washington)" received notice, and upon information and belief, residents on the south side of 7<sup>th</sup> Street received notice, and residents on the north side did not. It also appears that residents along Prairie Street from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and along Washington between 7<sup>th</sup> Street and down 8<sup>th</sup> Street by City Hall did not receive notice.
- 56. The October 28, 2020 letter only provided notice of tree trimming in the "RE: Tree trimming involved with upgrading the electrical system" in bold, and removal disclosed in the narrative. There is no notice whatsoever regarding replacement of existing poles with taller poles, 10 feet taller along 7th Street, and reconfiguring and reconductoring of the line.
  - 57. As above, it appears that what notice was provided was not in compliance with the permit conditions, points 1 and 7:
    - 1. Permittee must inform all affected property owners in writing of the proposed work prior to work commencing. Please forward written notice to

- the City of Northfield as well. This notice must also include a contact person for all project related questions from affected property owners.
- 7. The Contractor MUST inform property owners of impending tree removals, including trees in the ROW.

Ex. A, p. 4 and 15.

- 58. Residents along this route have personal knowledge of the potential impacts that the City should consider in reviewing a project permit.
- 59. Plaintiff seeks remitter to the City for public process where the community and affected landowners may raise their concerns, and that the Planning Commission and City Council review the project, consider issues raised, and make specific Findings of Fact regarding this project, sufficient to support a decision to grant or deny a permit for this project.

#### PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays that this Court enter judgment:

- 1. Declaring that the conduct of the City and its agents in permitting the powerline upgrade and uprate; in failing to conduct environmental review in the form of an Environmental Assessment for all phases of this multi-phased and connected, project; failing to provide notice; improperly granting a permit after work had already begun; granting a permit without Planning Commission and City Council notice and review; granting a permit for a "powerline to nowhere" with no plan to reach the substation to complete the circuit; and failing to provide public process for participation in developing the record for Findings of Fact to support a permitting decision; is in violation of the Minnesota Environmental Rights Act and Minnesota Environmental Policy Act; remmitur as provided by Minn. Stat. §116B.10.
- 2. Awarding costs and expenses of this action, including reasonable attorneys' fees to

Plaintiffs; and

3. Granting of such other relief as the Court deems just, equitable, and proper.
