## 2020 Overdoses & Opioid Deaths in Goodhue County


Goodhue County Compared to Greater Minnesota and Minnesota

## Preliminary data show there was no increase in 2020 in overdose deaths in Goodhue County.


Overdose deaths and opioid-involved overdose deaths have risen overall since 2000, following the trends in Greater Minnesota and Minnesota.









Preliminary data show opioid-involved overdose deaths remained stable in Goodhue County in 2020 after spiking in 2019, even as opioid deaths sharply increased in Minnesota overall. Data for 2020 is preliminary and likely to change.
