An Open Letter to Police Officials

We should fully recognize the importance of law enforcement at all times and under every possible condition. No community is a good place to live in where police officials do not do their duty fearlessly. The lawless elements continuously seek protection from the hand of the Law and it is startling to what degree they are successful. Bribes and graft money enter into nearly all the arrangements made between the law violators and officials of the law. Enumerable temptations are thrown in the paths of public officials and the weakness of the flesh opens the way to protection. The failure of police officials come to our attention every day in the year and no person can truthfully say that law is fully enforced. When even the most indifferent observer is astounded by the laxity of law enforcement, surely there is a great need for some very determined action. Alibis are not in order, excuses are uninteresting, promise after promise followed by inaction are rediculous, temporary spurts of enforcement featured in the daily press deceive very few. We emphasize it-"If officers of the law can't enforce the law the KU KLUX KLAN. In the name of the people the Klan demands better law enforcement. Every policeman, every sheriff and every officer of the law is under scrutiny and a day of judgment is not far away for every official who fails to do his duty. The people demand results from the duly constituted officers of the law, and by the eternal they are going to get results or know the reason.

Things have come to a pretty pass when scarlet women can ply their hellish business with little trouble, when bootleggers can sell their poison with considerable safety, when gambling is winked at with smiling indifference, when crooks of every kind evade the penalties of the law so frequently as to seem commonplace. It is time to take law enforcement out of dirty politics. Too many police officials have permitted the lawless to get the "goods on them" making it nearly impossible for them to do their duty without receiving threats of exposure. Political gangsters frequently swing the whip-"I'll see that you are fired if you don't play with me." The average policeman is a mighty fine fellow and would go the limits to get law violators, but is held back by "higher ups." The Ku Klux Klan is preaching a gospel of law enforcement by legal methods and legally it will make every effort to bring about better con-

An officer (433) was seen slapping a poorly dressed man and with a profanity that was worse than vicious, shouted, "I told you to stay off the street; get out of here in a hurry." A lady standing nearby could hardly believe that police officials had a right to strike any person who made not the slightest effort to resist arrest, neither could she believe that it was the right thing for an officer to use dirty language on the street where women were standing around. A policeman represents the law and wears the uniform of the law-he should at all times act truly regarding his important place in society. The least the officer of the law should do would be to respect the uniform he wears.

Recently a man was seen serving as an officer of the law, who as an officer had been found guilty of violating law, and after paying the penalty of his unlawful act had been reinstated. When a police official has been found guilty of violating law that should forever bar him from service as an officer of the law. We understand that in a certain community there is a man serving as a detective who as an officer of the law violated the prohibition laws and was found guilty and punished. It is alleged that this man's name is Lavalle or La Valle. Anyway we are going to invest the matter when we visit the community again. No person should serve in the law enforcement department of any city or county that has an unsavory reputation.

Every good citizen will stand back of police officials that do their duty. As a whole the people of this country want laws enforced. The Ku Klux Klan does and will always assist all officials of the law in their legal duties. The four-square police official has a loyal friend in every Klansman, but the crooked or incompetent officer of the law can expect nothing but hostility from the Klan. Who laid the foundations of the Universe? Who planned the harmonious movement of the millions of stars, planets, sattelites, meteors? Who initiated the laws whereby order came out of chaos? Who clothed the earth with vegetation and placed You say that you believe that God is powerful enough to do fish in the streams and oceans, birds in the trees, animals everywhere?

God-the First Cause.

Yet I hear a voice shouting, "Evolution explains creation." I believe in progress. But who laid down the laws of evolution? I think that I know the theories of evolution about as well as most of you and in my knowledge of evolution I'm not far behind the leaders who are advancing the theory of evolution. So much has been written and said about evolution that professors and others who stand out as evolutionists are lost in the wilds of uncertainty. The fact of the whole situation is that what little is known is so vague that we have very little ground on which to stand in our general acceptance of the theories of evolution. We can see the workings of laws of evolution but that is about all-we know scarcely nothing about these laws. Evolutionists are still theoretical in their reasoning. Now I come back to my query: Who initiated the laws of evolution? If God brought forth the Universe and all that is therein according to the theories now quite generally accepted, does that detract from God's glory? If God in His wisdom saw fit to slowly create everything according to some laws of action, does that remove God as the First Cause? That he was rewarded is proved by his election to the Senate, replacing Senator Atlee Pomerene.

It is, perhaps, a bit early to predict the fate of the bill in the 68th Congress, as the committees which existed in the Sixty-seventh do not hold over to the Sixty-eighth, necessarily. The Senate is a continuing body, the House is not. All committees there have to be re-constituted, but, according to custom, the old members of the committee will hold over.

Therefore, in the House, due to the retirement of Judge Towner, who has been made Governor of Porto Rico, and the election of Dr. Fess to the Senate, the chairmanship of the House Education Committee devolves upon Representative Frederick W. Dallinger, of Massachusetts.
