### NORTHERN MAN LAUDS WORK OF THE OLD KLAN The following is an extract from "Secret Political Societies

in the South during the period of Reconstruction," written by Walter Henry Cook, of Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio.

"The Ku Klux Klan accomplished much. From a political viewpoint it secured home rule for several of the Southern States. It ended the disgraceful rule of the carpetbaggers therein, and it helped to re-establish honest and efficient governmental institutions. The example was an inspiration which, after 1872, soon led the men of the Southern States still in radical control of a GLORIOUS VICTORY in regaining self-government.
