
Attached please find executed Complaint for Violation of the Campaign Finance and Fair Campaign Practices Acts, filing fee, and "attachment" below with the specifics of the Complaint.

This Complaint is regarding coordinated acts, statutory violations including failure to file, reporting errors, and missing and unaccounted for funds of a group of individuals, acting as the Committee to Recall City Hall and Citizens for Responsible Government/Govt (unregistered); and candidates running for City Council as a block: Janie M. Farrar, Ron Goggin, Ted Seifert, and Jason Snyder; and Don Kliewer, elected to City Council in August 9, 2022 Special Election.

The specific statutes at issue are: Minn. Stat. §211A.02; Minn. Stat. §211A.05; Minn. Stat. §211A.06; Minn. Stat. §211A.09 and Minn. Stat. §211B.04; Minn. Stat. §211B.06; and Minn. Stat. §211B.17. The most serious violations are of Minn. Stat. §211A.06 regarding the \$5,593.63 missing from the Recall City Hall reports, and Minn. Stat. §211B.06 regarding the multiple false statements in the "Citizens for Responsible Govt" flyer dated October 31, 2022.

I. RECALL CITY HALL

Recall City Hall has failed to account for a significant sum, \$5,593.63 as of its August 10, 2022 Report, \$5,569.96 as of the prior report in November 30 2021. Other specific reporting errors in the Committee's Reports are itemized below. As noted below, principals of Recall City Hall have filed for Red Wing City Council, and are reporting expenses exceeding, and at times grossly exceeding, amounts taken in, and the missing Recall City Hall funds may have been diverted to these candidates or "Citizens for Responsible Government." Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account. Because the "Recall City Hall" principals have run and now been



elected to City Office, specifically Ron Goggin and Janie Farrar, Minn. Stat. §211A.09 and Minn. Stat. §211B.17 FORFEITURE OF NOMINATION OR OFFICE may be applicable.

Recall City Hall, a ballot question committee as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 7c, seeking a recall election for 6 of 7 Red Wing City Council members, filed Campaign Financial Reports dated 3-10-21 to cover 2-25-21 to 3-10-21 and Amended report for that same period dated 3-29-21; 5-31-21 for period 3-10-21 to 5-31-21 and Amended report for that same period dated 11-30-21; 11-31-21 for period dated 6/1/21 to 11-30-21; and 8/10/22 for period from 12-1-21 to 8-10-22. The Campaign Financial Reports as filed, with my blue pen comments and highlighting are attached. Reports as filed are available online: https://www.red-wing.org/1062/ 2021 Recall Petitions are also online.

Report does not list "Disbursements" listed in itemization and claims "NONE." Report lists large amounts of "Anonymous" donations (Report lists Theodore (Ted) Seifert Ron Goggin, Council candidates as donors.)

Report does not list "Disbursements" listed in itemization and claims "NONE." Report lists in-kind donation from "Ask Shelley," Ask Shelly Virtual Assistant, LLC, was terminated 4/3/2019 via Statement of Termination

5-31-2021 Report for period 3-10-21 to 5-31-21

Report shows \$9,160.00 cash taken in, prior report shows \$3,620.00 cash on hand, totaling \$13,780.00, less \$7,384.11 equals \$5,395.89 cash on hand, BUT report states cash on hand as \$1,775.89 (this was corrected in Amended filing below).

Report lists Janie Farrar, current Council candidate as donor, both cash and in-kind.

Report corrects missing \$3,620 from cash on hand reported on 5-31-21.

Report lists 3/20/21 expenditure of \$200 as "Resource" and IDs this as payment to Kent Laugen, whose law license is "involuntarily restricted by court order."

Report totals \$9,858, an additional \$698 that is not listed on original (\$9,160)

8-10-22 Report for period 12-1-21 to 8-10-22 – Certified by Paul Kampe (see Goggin Reports). Report shows disbursement to New River Assembly, where Recall City Hall meetings were held, and this disbursement may or may not be violation of Minn. Stat §211B.08 Solicitations of Contributions Prohibited; see also Minn. Stat §211B.12, Legal Expenditures.

Report shows disbursement on 7-19-22 of \$300 for "Chamber of Commerce Parade Spot" for Red Wing's River City Days. Upon information and belief, there was no "Recall City Hall" unit in the parade. The Recall City Hall effort ended with the City's denial of Petitions for recall election in May and June 2021, over one year prior.²

II. CITIZENS FOR RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT

Citizens for Responsible Government is an unregistered entity, and is either a "Political Committee" as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 27, or an "Independent Expenditure Political Committee" as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 18a, and which has failed to register with Campaign Finance Board and has failed to file Campaign Financial Reports. Minn. Stat. 211A.05. Citizens for Responsible Government has also failed to keep account of income (unknown) and outgo for expenses such as parade expense and mailing of thousands of flyers.

Citizens for Responsible Government participated in the August 2022 River City Days parade,

likely using the line-up spot paid for by Recall City Hall (reported in 8-10-22 Report), and upon information and belief, using a truck pulling a cargo trailer owned by Council candidate Jason Snyder with "Citizens for Responsible Government" lettering on the trailer, covered by candidate signs and surrounded by those candidates. None of these candidates reported paying a parade entry fee.

Citizens for Responsible Government mailed at least one flyer to many homes in Red Wing. See attached "The time for removal of the current council has finally arrived!" Removal of the Council was the aim of "Recall City Hall," and those running for City Council seats are ones who donated, via cash or in-kind, to Recall City Hall; walked recall petitions around town; participated at demonstrations at City Hall; and were the public face of the Recall effort documented in media articles and social. See also new articles.

Minn. Stat. §211B.06, Subd. 1a. FALSE POLITICAL AND CAMPAIGN MATERIAL.

The flyer sent by "Citizens for Responsible Government" used language, topic headings, and language from the "Recall City Hall" website⁵. The flyer contained inflammatory hyperbole and opinions, but more importantly, it contained many false statements, in violation of Minn. Stat. §211B.06, Subd. 1a. See **Flyer**, attached following Recall City Hall CFB Reports. Examples:

- "The city-wide recall 18 months ago was successful and certified by our city clerk." The Recall Petitions were certified by City Clerk and signatures were gathered, but Petitions were not successful on advice of City Attorney that Petitions did not meet malfeasance and/or misfeasance threshold, Council denied Petitions and did not schedule election.
- "The current council was able to avoid a special election by directing the city attorney to

- threaten both the recall attorney and the recall petitioners with the full legal costs of the city if the lawsuit was lost." The Recall lawsuit was withdrawn and dismissed after notification that a Rule 11 challenge would be filed.
- "This council blatantly refused to follow the by-laws of the City Charter regarding recalls." The Charter "by-laws" do not address recall. Recall is provided for in the City Charter, Sections 6.12 6.17.
- "An overwhelming majority of Red Wing did not want police chief Roger Pohlman fired." Just over 2,000, or 20%, of the registered voters signed petitions for recall, which is far less than "overwhelming," and there is no factual basis for a statement regarding whether a majority of voters did not want Pohlman fired.
- "They ruined his career..." Pohlman was fired on February 19, 2021, and was offered job as Lakefield Police Chief on March 1, 2021, less than two weeks later. See 3-3 and 3-10-21 Lakefield articles attached.
- "After spending nearly \$8,000... City staff then buried this report and refused to share it with the public because it did not support their narrative."
 - O The report referred to was from 2018, and was not the cause of Pohlman's firing three years later. The report is discussed in a disingenuous 3-11-2021 opinion piece, "Telling the full story means knowing the whole story," attached. That the report is confidential, and Todd claims to have a copy, provided by an unnamed individual.⁶
 - O The report was not "buried." Personnel matters are confidential by law, and it is up to the person who is the subject of the matter to disclose or not disclose. Roger Pohlman is the only one who can disclose, and this information is not legally available through a Data Practices Act request.
- "... this council has spent millions of dollars on acquiring real estate projects best left to private sector developers. "[m]illions of dollars" is unsubstantiated and false. The Council President reports under \$1 million in City property purchases:

Fiscal Responsibility

The letter claims this council has spent millions of dollars on acquiring real estate projects. More false statements.

To the best of my knowledge, since in office there have been three significant real estate purchases by the city, and one by the Port.

1- purchase of property at the Riverview Skyway landing as part of the long term Upper Harbor redevelopment plan. This purchase was approximately \$100,000

2-purchase of the Bauer Built property for around \$450,000. This had a few purposes: to support local businesses by providing ample parking in West End during reconstruction and to help attract a developer that would add to the retail, dining, entertainment district of this district, further stimulating the economy.

3-purchase a segment of CP Rail property for \$90,000. This project and the funds had been set aside for that purchase for years before I was even on council. This has been a project in the works since 2005. While it is an expensive project, it will not be completed without state or federal funds. But owning the property is the necessary step in applying for those funds.

4-The Port Authority approved the purchase of a small piece of property near the Maltery building for about \$100,000. This was to ensure that it would be ready to sell to anyone who would want to develop the Maltery building or that corner into a project.

- "... suggested removing the chief would be a good start in healing the community." This is false.
- "The city of Red Wing received a total of about \$3,9 million in COVID Cares ACT money. Prior to distributing any to the private sector who it was intended for, the City siphoned nearly 40% (\$1.2 million) fio City Administration needs." Use by the City was an intended purpose. Id.

During 202 the Port authorized between \$900,000 - \$1,000,000 to small businesses to assist them and their employees during 2020. The City also collaborated with other organizations to purchase and provide for personal protection equipment to help keep businesses, employees, and residents safe.

The letter specifically cites the use of those funds as hazard pay, which was an eligible use of the funds, so I'll focus on that. Here again, they're misleading the reader by making false statements that only brush against the truth.

All City employees adjusted their work schedules and personal lives to ensure city services were maintained: garbage, water, streets, parks, library services, public safety, and all the city functions were all maintained during this time.

Union employees received a 4% lump sum for their work during Covid in 2020.

Non-union employees also received hazard pay compensation - the amount they received was adjusted based on the class/type of work they do. Jobs in grades A-B are more hourly employees and often have more interaction with the public or each other, they received a prorated 4% lump sum. Grade C are middle level management and received 3% of their salary in lump sum. Employees in grades D-F such as department heads and administrators received only 2%.

The flyer closed stating:

Written & produced by Citizens for Responsible Govt. P.O. Box 519, Red Wing, MN 55066 without any candidate involvement or endorsement.

This disclaimer is not the language required by statute, and does not specify whether or not it is an "independent expenditure." Minn. Stat. §211B.04 Campaign Material Must Include Disclaimer.

The photos, new articles, parade activities and flyer shows that these efforts were coordinated, not independent. Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 18. "Recall City Hall," "Citizens for Responsible Government" and current City Council candidates are a close knit group, running as a bloc, a group that has been working in concert, coordinating, for over a year, through the Recall City Hall, the City Council Special Election, and the City Council November 8, 2022 election.

III. CANDIDATES FOR CITY COUNCIL

Candidates Janie M. Farrar, Ron Goggin, Ted Seifert, Jason Snyder and Don Kliewer are local candidates as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 10d, candidates for Red Wing City Council who ran as a bloc in 2022. Janie M. Farrar and Ron Goggin were elected on November 8, 2022, and Don Kliewer was elected in a special election on August 9, 2022. Ted Seifert and Jason Snyder lost their respective contests.⁹

All of the Reports filed by these candidates have deficiencies and errors, some simple addition, some material omissions. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account. Although the amounts in question are not as high as the \$5,593.63 missing funds in the Recall City Hall reports, some are substantial, and Minn. Stat. §211A.09 and Minn. Stat. §211B.17 FORFEITURE OF NOMINATION OR OFFICE may be applicable.

A. Janie Farrar – Elected to Red Wing City Council November 8, 2022

Janie Farrar is a local candidate as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 10d, and filed Campaign Financial Reports, attached. Reports certified by Josephine M. Schendel. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account.

- Farrar did not report paying a Council filing fee;
- Farrar did not report paying a parade fee to the Chamber of Commerce for the Red Wing River City Days parade;
- Report of 10-28-22 shows self in-kind contributions of \$6,752.55, but in-kind listed as \$6,935.65 with no explanation of different in-kind numbers.
- The numbers reported on her Reports of 7-20-2022, 7-29-2022, and 10-29-2022 do not add up.
- Farrar was principal of the Recall City Hall committee, active in soliciting signatures and presenting as public face of the effort. 10

B. Ron Goggin – Elected to Red Wing City Council November 8, 2022

Ron Goggin is a local candidate as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 10d, and filed Campaign Financial Reports, attached. Gogin's reports were certified by Paul Kampe, who also certified the Recall City Hall reports. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account.

Ron Goggin did not report paying a Council filing fee or parade fee to the Chamber of Commerce for the Red Wing River City Days parade, and marched in the parade and had his campaign signs displayed on the Citizens for Responsible Government trailer.

- 7-18-22 Goggin Reports a prohibited corporate contribution from Demorett Enterprises Inc in the amount of \$100. Minn. Stat \$211B.15 Corporate Political Contributions.
- 7-18-22 Report shows "N/A" for addresses for 7 contributions.
- 10-29-22 Report does not list employers for the Guerbers.
- 10-29-22 The numbers on this report are significantly off.

Ron Goggin was a principal of Recall City Hall as one of the 5 Petitioners for Recall City Hall

using the name of a Hamline citizen advocacy project, then "Red Wing Citizens Assemble" and then "Red Wing Community News. After the Pohlmans moved to Lakefield, Paul Kampe became the moderator.

C. Don Kliewer – Elected to City Council August 9, 2022

Don Kliewer, elected to Red Wing City Council, in a 2022 Special Election, was a candidate as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 10d. Don Kliewer ran for the vacant Ward 2 City Council seat and was elected in the august 9, 2022 Special Election. He filed three Campaign Financial Reports, certified by Kliewer.

- Kliewer's 7-15-22 Report shows \$900 in cash raised, \$232 of in-kind contributions, totaling \$1,132, claims expenditures of \$806.60, but states an ending balance of \$900 cash-on-hand. The numbers do not add up, and there is no explanation of the roughly \$320 difference.
- 7-29-22 Report for time period of 7-15-22 to 7-29-22 reports \$876.60 cash contributions, but page 2 shows \$2,008.60.

- 7-29-22 page to shows four of the contributions should have been included on the 7-15-22 Report, totaling \$1,738.60, and that report has not been amended.
- 7-29-22 Report shows 7-12-22 in-kind donation of \$232 which is also listed on page 1 of the 7-15-22 Report.
- 7-29-22 Report page 2 should only include the 7-17-22 contribution of \$200 and arguably the undated \$20 and \$50 cash donations, totaling \$270.
- 7-29-22 Report shows cash contributions received as \$876.60, which apparently represents the 7-8-22 loan of \$806.60 plus the cash donations of \$20 and \$50 that total \$876.60.
- 7-29-22 Report claims \$185 cash-on-hand, which, subtracted from the \$876.60 collected, is \$691.60, yet disbursements for this same period are \$1,012.
- 7-29-22 Report shows total disbursements of \$1,823.60, which is the total of the 7-15-22 and 7-29-22 reports, not the \$1,012 disbursements in the 7-29-22 report time period.
- 7-29-22 Report, based on dates of attachment, disbursements should be corrected.
- 8-12-22 Report shows no cash or in-kind contributions. From the \$185 (erroneously) reported on the 7-29-22 report, with no revenue and \$243.83 expenses on 8-1-22, the balance would be -\$58.83.
- 8-12-22 Report states cash-on-hand is \$106.17, with no explanation.
- Reports of 7-29 and 8-12-22 show contributions of \$2,008.60 and disbursements of \$2,067.43, with apparent balance of \$58.83.

Don Kliewer did not report paying a Council filing fee or parade fee to the Chamber of Commerce for the Red Wing River City Days parade and marched in the parade and had his campaign signs displayed on the Citizens for Responsible Government trailer, and the numbers in his Report do not add up. The Campaign Financial Reports have not been amended. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account.

D. Ted Seifert – lost contest for Ward 4 City Council

Ted Seifert was a principal of Recall City Hall as one of the 5 Petitioners for Recall City Hall Petitions who also took Petitions door to door soliciting signatures:

Seifert's Campaign Financial Reports are deficient, spending more than was taken in, with no explanation.

- 7-29-22 Report states report covers 5-31-22 to 6-29-22, which appears a simple error.
- 7-29-22 Report shows no income.
- 7-29-22 Report shows \$126 in expenses but no indication of how paid.
- 7-29-22 report total is -\$126.00.
- 10-29-22 Report shows \$100 cash contribution, with \$655.86 in expenses, and no indication how expenses were paid.
- 10-29-22 numbers total -\$555.86
- 7-29-22 and 10-29-22 reports total deficiency of \$681.86

Ted Seifert did not report paying a parade fee to the Chamber of Commerce for the Red Wing River City Days parade, and the numbers on his Reports do not add up. The Campaign Financial Reports have not been amended. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account. Ted Seifert coordinated with Citizens for Responsible Government and marched in the parade and had his campaign signs displayed on the Citizens for Responsible Government trailer. See photos above.

E. Jason Snyder – Lost contest for Ward 3 Council

Jason Snyder is a local candidate as defined by Minn. Stat. §10A.01, Subd. 10d, and filed Campaign Financial Reports, attached. Reports certified by Snyder.

Those Reports have multiple issues:

- 10-4-22 Report states \$150 cash and \$60 in-kind contribution, an \$1,478.71 in Disbursements, a deficit of \$1,337.71 if considering only cash contributions, or if including in-kind contributions, \$1,277.71.
- 10-4-22 Report gives no indication how those disbursements were paid.
- 10-4-22 Report does not show a disbursement matching or totaling the \$60 in-kind donation.
- 10-4-22 Report does not show a disbursement for the City Council filing fee.
- 10-31-22 Report shows \$100 cas and \$143.81 in-kind contributions.
- 10-31-22 Report shows \$1.091.63 in expenses leaving a \$991.63 deficit, or including the \$143.91 in-kind, though no matching disbursement, a \$847.82 deficit.
- 10-31-22 Report does not show a disbursement matching the \$60 in-kind contribution.
- Reports, when subtracting expenses from cash contributions, show a \$2,329.34 deficit, or including in-kind contributions (though no matching disbursements) a \$2,125.53 deficit.

Jason Snyder did not report paying a Council filing fee or a parade fee to the Chamber of Commerce for the Red Wing River City Days parade. Upon information and belief, Jason Snyder is the owner of the truck and trailer used in the Red Wing River City Days and which was labeled "Citizens for Responsible Government" and was covered with signs of the candidates who are the subject of this report. He reports significant expenses paid, over \$1,000 in each report, yet reports only taking in \$150 and \$100. These reports, filed 10-4-22 and 10-31-22, have not been amended. Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account.

As above, this Complaint is regarding coordinated acts, statutory violations including failure to file, reporting errors, and missing and unaccounted for funds of a group of individuals, acting as:

- Committee to Recall City Hall;
- Citizens for Responsible Government/Govt (unregistered); and
- Candidates running for City Council as a bloc:
 - o Janie M. Fararr, elected to Red Wing City Council At-Large on November 8, 2022.
 - o Ron Goggin, elected to Red Wing City Council Wards 1 & 2 on November 8, 2022;
 - o Don Kliewer, elected to City Council in August 9, 2022 Special Election.
 - o Ted Seifert and Jason Snyder, who both lost in the November 8, 2022 election.

The specific statutes at issue, as set forth above, are:

- Minn. Stat. §211A.02 Financial Report
- Minn. Stat. §211A.05 Failure to File Statement
- Minn. Stat. §211A.06 Failure to Keep Account
- Minn. Stat. §211A.09 Forfeiture of Nomination or Office

- Minn. Stat. §211B.06 False Political and Campaign Material
- Minn. Stat. §211B.17 Forfeiture of Nomination or Office

The most serious violations are the \$5,593.63 missing from the Recall City Hall reports, and the multiple false statements in the "Citizens for Responsible Govt" flyer dated October 31, 2022 and that entity's failure to register as a Committee.



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The time for removal of the current council has finally arrived!

The city-wide recall 18 months ago was successful and certified by our city clerk. The current council was able to avoid a special election by directing the city attorney to threaten both the recall attorney and the recall petitioners with the full legal costs of the city if the lawsuit was lost. This council blatantly refused to follow the by-laws of the City Charter regarding recalls. For a city to threaten its own citizens for exercising their rights is both pathetic and unacceptable.

We want to see Red Wing flourish with a council that is focused on listening to the will of the people. The citizens of Red Wing are at the top of the city organizational chart. This fact is neglected at every council meeting by Council President Becky Norton and member Dean Hove.

We as citizens deserve a council that will be efficient and fiscally responsible in order to create a town that works. This council has failed on many levels:

- 1. Personal Agendas are not acceptable: An overwhelming majority of Red Wing did not want police chief Roger Pohlman fired. This council refused to listen to the will of the people and fired him without cause. They ruined his career by using him as a pawn to satisfy their personal desires for "Social Justice". After spending nearly \$8,000 of taxpayer money to paint him as guilty, a 3rd party attorney, hired by the council found him completely exonerated of all charges with no evidence supporting the allegations. City staff then buried this report and refused to share it with the public because it did not support their narrative.
- 2. Fiscal Responsibility: Under the reckless leadership of Norton and Hove, this council has spent millions of dollars on acquiring real estate projects best left to private sector developers.
- 3. Wisdom: This council has spent tens of thousands of citizen money on hiring outside consultants for unnecessary studies. Recent examples include \$20,000 for a racial equity advisor from Baltimore who attended two meager Zoom meetings to help spin the local dialogue to declare Systemic racism as a public health emergency and suggested removing the chief would be a good start in healing the community. Secondly, \$30,000 was paid to an outside consultant to study Red Wing's homeless crisis, create a PowerPoint and present it to the council. Reality is on any given evening about 5-6 people need housing in Red Wing.
- 4. Compassion: The city of Red Wing received a total of about \$3.9 million in COVID Cares ACT money. Prior to distributing any to the private sector who it was intended for, the city siphoned nearly 40% (\$1.2 million) for City Administration needs. This included hazard & sick pay to department heads like Kay Kuhlman and others who worked from home. This division of money was approved under the leadership of Norton and Hove. Self-serving at best, morally bankrupt at worst. Red Wing deserves better leadership.

The Lakefield City Council offered Roger Pohlman of Red Wing the position of police chief during a special meeting Monday night.

Pohlman spoke before the council Monday, giving a summary of his experience in law enforcement and answering questions from council members about specific aspects of his work.

"I originally grew up in Sioux Valley, graduated in 1981, ended up in active-duty Air Force and, after 10 years, I joined the Grand Forks Police Department and rose through the ranks," Pohlman said.

Pohlman has experience leading law enforcement departments, as he moved to Red Wing and became its chief of police after leaving Grand Forks.

"I held that position for the past eight years," Pohlman said.

Pobliman said he wants to come to Lakefield to finish his career on a strong note and serve a tight-knit community close to home that shares his values.

"I see this as a great opportunity to end my career the way law enforcement should be," Pohlman said. "I believe law enforcement should be community focused.

He got a chance to touch on his experience leading youth programs in Red Wing as well.

"I was a GREAT (Gang Resistance Education and Training) instructor," Pohlman said. "It doesn't tell students what they should or shouldn't do; instead, it teaches people how to make good decisions."

Pohlman received positive feedback about the program from students in Red Wing and said he'd be willing to implement a similar program in Lakefield.

"I believe strongly in the program," Pohlman said. "I think it helps out young people get off on the right foot and make good decisions that last a lifetime."

Council members were impressed with Pohlman's resume and elected to make him the offer after he answered

"I've done my own research, and everything I've come across that I think is credible speaks very highly as a candidate," said council member Brent Pavelko.

Council member Nathan Hall agreed.

"I don't think we're gonna find someone with more experience," Hall said.

Council member Bruce Bakalyar made a motion to offer Pohlman the position, which was seconded by Half and unanimously agreed upon by the council. Pohlman will give his answer in writing after reviewing health insurance information in the coming days.

The world doesn't often surprise me.

In 20-plus years as a journalist, I've seen a lot of weird things, and heard a lot of odd statements from folks. That's part and parcel of conducting interviews with a vast cross-section of humanity.

So it's not every day something amazes me.

That's Amazing, Folks

When I interviewed Red Wing Mayor Mike Wilson concerning the firing of Police Chief Roger Pohlman, I heard something that kind of shocked

me.

First, let me back up a second. Before talking to Wilson, I was talking with another person. A person I won't name. This person told me about a complaint made against Pohlman in late 2018 that the city hired an outside investigator to look into to try judging the veracity of the complaint.

The complaint and the investigation, it seems, once delivered to the city council, Pohlman and a few others in 2019 was then confiscated by the city.

You read that right. After the report was handed out, Council member Dean Hove demanded – and City Administrator Kay Kuhlmann executed that demand - that all copies of the report be returned to the city.

Why? Well, that's complicated, and I suppose I could understand their

See, in the time between Pohlman being put on paid leave on Feb. 8 and being fired on Feb. 19, Wilson, who was only elected last November, was hoping to learn all he could about Pohlman's performance. But when he asked for the complaint and report about which he'd heard rumors, he was told no. No, Mr. Mayor, you can't see this relevant piece of information.

Even as I spoke to him, Wilson seemed bemused by this.

"I tried to get that information too," Wilson said. "I was told by Kay the

city attorney said that information wasn't available to me."

Here's the thing: If you ask the right people, you'll find what you need to know. I found someone who didn't mind passing along the supersecret report. For a city that had fired Pohlman, I can see why. The report basically debunks the complaint against Pohlman, then goes on to praise his honesty and integrity.

Two weeks ago, I sent a request to the city of Red Wing asking for more information on this subject. Basically, I'm still waiting. Some of the complaints against Pohlman have to do with his attitude toward city council members' suggestions about law enforcement and the timeliness of his responses to their emails.

I'd like to see how the actual emails and the complaints against Pohlman match up. After all, folks are talking about recalling six members of the city council, so I'm guessing there's a big contingent of residents who aren't happy the chief was fired.

I'm still digging for information, because people want answers, and the only way I can find them is to know a lot of information.



Committee outlines work needed to recall Red Wing City Council members

A grassroots recall campaign is planning its steps to bring six of seven council members before a special election.

RED WING — About 75 people showed up Tuesday night to hear leaders of an effort to recall six members of the Red Wing City Council.

George Hintz, who started the recall effort with a call to action during the public comment period of a city council meeting in February, said yard signs have been bought, a bank account has been opened and the committee is ready to collect signatures for a petition, which the group hopes to turn over to the city within a few weeks.

"Talk to friends," Hintz advised those in attendance Tuesday at New River Assembly of God Church. 'Ask them to come to the next general meeting."

Hintz, former Red Wing City Council Member Peggy Rehder and Tom Wilder led the discussion about the recall steps taken so far and those that are planned.

The recall effort began as a response to the city council's 6-1 vote on Feb. 19 to fire then-Red Wing Police Chief Roger Pohlman. While Pohlman has moved onto a new job as chief of police in Lakefield, Minn., the city he's left behind is still asking how the city council can justify firing him.

Former Goodhue County Board member Ted Seifert, who ran and lost against City Council President Becky Norton in 2018, said Pohlman was the right man for the job.

"I couldn't think of anybody better to be chief of police in Red Wing

than Roger Pohlman," Seifert said. "When the City Council fired him, well, they're going in the wrong direction."

But Seifert said there are other concerns that show the council needs to be replaced before it does more harm. He cited the "bridge to nowhere" pedestrian bridge near Old Main Street and said the council is trying to mirror recent moves by the Minneapolis City Council.

"They have an agenda, and I don't think it's an agenda that works well in Red Wing," Seifert said.

Rehder said the next step in the recall effort is to write up 250-word complaints against each member of the city council that will outline their malfeasance or nonfeasance on the job, a statutory requirement.

Violations of the state's open meeting law, she said, is just one of the counts of malfeasance that works against the City Council members.

Other members of the audience said that firing Pohlman puts the city at risk since his job is now being done by a captain who still performs his own duties along with the chief's duties. Others complained that the whole process was done in secret without any input from the public.

During the meeting Tuesday there were several calls to action and requests for volunteers. For example, Rehder said the committee will likely need to raise funds for legal battles if the city or individual council members contest the validity of the petitions – either the signatures gathered during the two petition phases, or whether the charges meet the definition of malfeasance. Rehder asked for a volunteer to lead fundraising efforts for the committee.

"One of my big concerns is this is going to be pretty expensive," Rehder said. "We will be challenged by these council members in court."

Others suggested more grassroots efforts such as getting individuals to

commit to showing up for city council meetings and talking about the recall movement during public comment periods, and writing letters to the editor to outline why the group wants to recall the six council members.

According to the Red Wing City Charter, there are several steps to the recall process. The first is for at least five registered voters from the ward (or whole city for at-large candidates) to bring a petition containing a 250-word statement of the grounds for removal to the city.

Once that petition is approved, the group has 30 days to collect signatures of 20 percent of registered voters from the last election in the ward (or whole city for at-large candidates) to force the recall of a specific candidate.

If the second petition and signatures are valid, the city would set a recall election between 45 and 60 days from that point.

Despite the hurdles, Wilder said he's ready, and from the phone calls he receives, he believes residents of Red Wing want this recall to happen.

"City Hall isn't concerned, City Hall doesn't think it's real," Wilder said.
"But I get phone calls every day asking what this group has done."







RED WING — Echoing its actions from May 24, the Red Wing City Council again voted Monday night against holding a special recall election for members of the city council.

On a 6-1 vote, with Council Member Kim Beise voting against the motion, the city council voted to decline setting an election for the recall of council members Erin Buss and Evan Brown.

The vote was preceded by more than a dozen people speaking either for or against the recall. Most individuals against the recall stood up to express their appreciation for the work done by the city council and the elected members of the body. They also talked about how the recall effort was working as a way to cancel their votes which elected those members.

Catherine Friend, who said she was disappointed the recall effort continues, said, "Because a group of residents did not like the results of the city council election, it seems they're trying to overturn the results by spreading disinformation by making false claims and by (convicing others) to sign the petitions."

Another opponent of the recall, Terese Bjornstad, called out Mayor Mike Wilson for "fanning division" in a recent story in the Red Wing newspaper. Bjornstad said she hoped Wilson would

stand up to the recall committee and use his platform to encourage the recall committee to end its efforts.

Stacy Devries said the recall was taking up too much time and energy from the city council and city staff, which could be better spending its time helping people who are suffering in Red Wing.

On the other side, Angela McGuire said she had voted for Evan Brown, but later found it "heartbreaking to hear about the removal of Chief Pohlman."

McGuire chastised the city council for firing a police chief who had a good "reputation across the county and across the state," adding that the process of Pohlman's firing included a "lot of closed doors and secret meetings."

Jason Snyder also commented on a lack of transparency regarding Pohlman's firing, saying the council has never explained what Pohlman did or what rules set down by the city council he broke that warranted firing.

"Look what you've done to this community," Snyder said. "All you had to do was hold the meeting in public."

Recall City Hall committee leader George Hintz told the city council that voting not to hold an election would eventually end in litigation against the city.

"This will be a legal battle that we will fight and win in the courts," Hintz said.

What happened? The Red Wing City Council voted 6-1 against setting a date for a special recall election for council members Evan Brown and Erin Buss. The city council held an identical vote May 24, deciding not to hold a special recall election for council members Andy Klitzke, Laurel Stinson and Becky Norton.

Why does this matter? The Recall City Hall committee has collected enough valid signatures to recall five of the seven city council members in Red Wing. However, the city holds the position that the justification for the recall does not meet the state's legal standard of malfeasance or nonfeasance.

What's next? The recall committee is waiting on the results of efforts to recall Council Member Dean Hove. Once a determination is made on Hove, the committee will likely take its case for a recall to court.

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
