Objectives of Today's Hearing

- To afford interested persons an opportunity to be heard regarding any matters relating to the siting of large electric generating power plants and routing of high-voltage transmission lines.
- ➤ To advise the public of the permits issued by the Commission in the past year. This may include a description of the projects initiated or completed this year, as well as projects currently pending or anticipated in the near future.

Role of Administrative Law Judge

- Preside over the public hearing
- Prepare a report summarizing the public comments for the Commission
- Issue a report within 60 days
 - No action on the report is required by the Commission
 - The purpose of the report is to inform the Commission


